## NARRATIVE - Original Narrative - Jeremy Holmes

On August 16th, 2021, I was assigned to day shift patrol duties for Grays Harbor County. At approximately 1125 hours, Deputy Iverson was dispatched to a domestic violence assault in progress call at 177 Bartell Road. I am familiar with this residence and the residents from past calls for service at the location. I responded to assist. While en-route, Deputy Denny (OIC at the time) requested Elma respond to assist.

I arrived on scene at approximately 1145 hours. Elma Police Sergeant Cristelli was on scene. Also present was Jordan Bowers and her boyfriend, Andrew Carlson. Sgt. Cristelli advised me that the previous night, someone broke the windows out to one of the vehicles. Andrew claimed Jordan did and Jordan claimed Andrew did this. Sgt. Cristelli advised that today, Andrew went to the shop on the property. Jordan kicked in the shop door and the door struck Andrew in the head.

I went and spoke to Andrew first. I saw a large hematoma (goose egg) on Andrew's forehead. Andrew said he just wanted an order put in place and for Jordan to leave. Andrew explained that the previous night, he was working on his truck when Jordan came outside and smashed out all of the windows with bolt cutters. Andrew separated himself and stayed the night in the shop. This morning, Jordan came to the shop and opened the door to the shop. Andrew said he grabbed a hay fork and set it across the inside of the shop door to barricade it. Andrew said as soon as he got the fork in place, Jordan kicked the door open. This caused the door to swing open and strike Andrew in the head. Andrew informed me that the door striking him was obviously just an accident and he did not believe Jordan meant to assault him.

I then spoke with Jordan about the incident. With Jordan were two young children who Jordan advised belonged to both her and Andrew. Jordan said Andrew was working on his vehicle the previous night when they got into an argument. Jordan said the argument started because she wanted to leave and Andrew flattened two of the tires to the SUV she was going to drive. Jordan pointed to a parked Chevrolet Suburban with two flat tires (both on the driver side). I later took photographs of this. Jordan said because of this, she went to use another truck. She pointed to a small pickup truck that appeared to be taken apart for mechanical work. Jordan said when she did this, Andrew took a hammer and started to smash all of the windows on the truck. I took photographs of this damage. I saw bolt cutters lying inside of the truck and also a hammer lying nearby the truck. Both tools were photographed. Jordan said today, she still wanted to leave but Andrew took her purse, which included her keys and cell phone, to the shop. Jordan said she went out to the shop to get her purse but the door would not open. Jordan said that the shop door never locks so she believed Andrew had barricaded it. Jordan said she shouldered her way through the door and it flew open. Jordan said the door did strike Andrew but she did not realize he was there and had no intention of assaulting Andrew. Jordan said Andrew told her that he was calling 911 now that he had an injury so Jordan would get arrested. Jordan said she got her purse and went back to the house. Jordan later provided me this information in a recorded statement.

Jordan said that her eight year old son, [Identifying] had witnessed Andrew smashing the small pickup's windows. I requested to speak with [Identify] I have training and experience in interviewing young children regarding criminal investigations and have completed the Child Forensic Interview Training through CJTC. I conducted a Forensic Interview with [Identif] in the field that was not recorded. I engaged [Identif] in conversation, going through the instructions of the interview with him and [Identify] promised to tell the truth. It should be noted that while speaking with [Identify] he would refer to Jordan as "mom" and Andrew as "dad".

As [Identif] and I talked about some of his hobbies, one being video games, [Identif] said, "I get confused because sometimes my mom lies to me and my dad lies to me." [Identif] said he was watching Call of Duty videos that were on Youtube, the night before on his TV and he did not see who broke out the windows of the pickup truck. [Identif] said the volume on his TV was up loud so he did not hear his mom and dad arguing either. [Identif] said that today, his mom told him to tell the Police that Andrew had broken out the truck windows. [Identify] then again said he did not know who broke out the windows. [Identif] said, "Andrew is hot headed but he usually does not break stuff. Mom is the one who breaks stuff." I spoke to [Identif] for a few more minutes before ending my contact with him.

At this time, Deputy Iverson arrived on scene. I requested his assistance with taking a statement from Andrew. Jordan provided me a voluntary recorded statement. Jordan's statement was uploaded to the GHSG drive at a later time. Once I was finished, Deputy Iverson informed me that Andrew refused to provide a

statement. I provided a DV literature card to Andrew and Jordan and then cleared. At a later time, I completed a restitution form regarding the damaged truck windows.

Jordan and Andrew have been in a dating relationship for approximately eight years and have two children in common. The damaged property was owned by both parties. With Jordan being the only one who provided me a statement, I have probable cause that Andrew did violate RCW 9A.48.090 by knowingly and maliciously causing physical damage by damaging truck windows of a vehicle that belongs to both him and Jordan.

I request this case be sent to the prosecutor and closed.
